Volunteer Job Descriptions

International Aid & Disaster Relief

Our Pharmaceutical and Clinic Development Programs distributes pharmaceutical packages that serve 25,000 individuals to small clinics in developing countries. The pharmaceutical package includes life-saving medicines such as anti-worming and anti-malaria medicines. We serve small incountry clinics with all of the supplies, equipment and pharmaceuticals needed to open or refurbish a clinic in areas that have no access to healthcare. We have an on-site biotech department that re-furbishes equipment for use in developing countries. In addition, our Disaster Relief efforts quickly and efficiently get supplies to emergency disaster situations. Giving Children Hope was a first responder in Haiti after it was hit by a 7.0 earthquake in 2010. GCH distributed over \$5 million worth of life-saving supplies and medicines to Haitians in need.

Medical Supply Inventory

Job Summary & Description:

As a part of our effort to support hospitals, clinics and medical missions throughout the world and in preparation for our disaster relief response packages, Giving Children Hope receives donations of medical supplies in bulk. These supplies then need to be sorted through, cataloged and organized. The volunteer will assist the Warehouse Manager and the rest of the Operations Staff in keeping our donations organized and ready for shipment. Volunteers will learn to identify the kinds of medical supplies in front of them.

"We've Got Your Back" Program

This is our local direct service program that serves <u>homeless elementary children</u> in Orange County. Giving Children Hope works through the schools and the Orange County Department of Education to supply 1,000 of the over 25,000 homeless children in Orange County with nutrition, education and food on a weekly basis.

Backpack Tasks

Job Summary & Description:

Do you enjoy meeting the needs of homeless children by providing a stable and nutritious source of food? Our flagship program, We've Got Your Back, is a weekend nutrition program created by Giving Children Hope for homeless elementary students in Orange County. Each week, we fill backpacks full of nutritious foods to distribute to elementary students who are identified as homeless under the McKinney-Vento Act. During the week, we need volunteers to commit to 3 hours or more by filling backpacks with donated food.

This opportunity requires volunteers to be available for the same two hour block of time each week throughout the summer.

Giving For Living Program/Missionary Program

The Giving for Living program serves over 200 nonprofit organizations in Southern California on a weekly basis with the <u>supplies they need</u> to run their organizations – from pregnancy centers to homeless shelters to drug rehab programs – Giving Children Hope helps local nonprofits fulfill their unique mission. Also, our Missionary Program is open from Monday through Friday and has an average of 40 visitors per week. Visitors are local nonprofit organizations, churches, or missionaries from around the world who come for over-the-counter medicines, hygiene, and beauty supplies.

Gift-in-Kind Product Sorting

Do you enjoy sorting through donations of merchandise? This is an ongoing, fun volunteer opportunity. Each week, we receive pallets of merchandise that needs to be sorted and placed into our local distribution center. From there it is available to local non-profit agencies and to the community to assist those in need. In order to create consistency among our volunteers, we have created the Volunteer Leader position. This position will give the volunteer an opportunity to gain valuable leadership skills within a nonprofit setting.

The Volunteer Leader Position is reserved for those who have volunteered with us regularly for 3 months and who have a demonstrated understanding of our mission and functionalities. In order to be considered for a Volunteer Leader position, motivated volunteers may inquire with Volunteer Coordinator. Although Volunteer Leaders will be supervised by Staff, they will be recognized as staff members and will begin as the Volunteer Leader in one particular department.

Guidelines for Volunteering

Orientation

It is recommended that new Volunteers attend one of our bi-monthly Volunteer Orientations. These hour long meetings will explain how Giving Children Hope got started and has expanded to its current potential. Volunteer Orientations consist of a tour of our 43,000 square foot facility, introductions to GCH staff and programs, Q&A, and Volunteer Scheduling.

Appointments and Scheduling

Individual Volunteers and groups of five or less can schedule Volunteer appointments in one of two ways: 1) Set a regular recurring schedule with the Volunteer Coordinator either on a weekly or monthly basis or 2) Give the Volunteer Coordinator at least 24 hours notice before you would like to come in.

Groups of 5-30 are required to arrange an appointment with the Volunteer Coordinator at least a week prior to the event. Priority will be given to groups on a first come first serve basis.

Giving Children Hope can accommodate groups of up to 120. It is preferable for Volunteer groups larger than 30 people to arrange their appointment with the Volunteer Coordinator one month prior to the event.

Check In

Volunteers arriving for a scheduled appointment should sign in at the front lobby and retrieve a Volunteer ID badge. Before proceeding directly to work, please let the Volunteer Coordinator know that you have arrived for your appointment. If the Volunteer Coordinator is off campus or detained, you may proceed to your pre-arranged Staff supervisor to begin volunteering.

Job Placement

Volunteers who have a preference for a particular program will be placed in that department as often as possible. Flexibility for job placement is appreciated as different departments frequently have large projects arise that need the contributing efforts of our Volunteers.

Volunteer Policies and Procedures

Directions

Volunteers will receive directions and supervision from Giving Children Hope Staff or a Volunteer Leader. Should you have any questions about a task or need further tools or support on a project, please consult your project leader.

Volunteer Shifts

The ideal volunteer shifts will last between two hours and five hours. Shifts of less than two hours will be permitted, though it is difficult to get momentum volunteers tasks for in that amount of time. Volunteers seeking to continue shifts longer than five hours will be asked to take a break before continuing their work. Volunteers should inform their project leader if they are leaving or need to take a break. The Volunteer break room is available in the B-Building for rest and lunch breaks.

Volunteer Records

Careful records of Volunteer hours and contribution are kept by the Volunteer Department. If Volunteers ever need a confirmation of hours contributed for a community service project or school credit please inform the Volunteer Coordinator; confirmation letters can be available within 24 hours of notice. Volunteer contact information will be kept in GCH records. If your records change, please inform any staff member so that our records can remain accurate.

Absence or Schedule Changes

If individual or small groups of Volunteers are unable to attend a Volunteer appointment or would like to change the time of their appointment, please give the Volunteer Coordinator at least a days notice, so that we can plan our Volunteer tasks with the most up to date information possible. Large groups of Volunteers are asked to keep the Volunteer Department informed of group size or time changes as soon as possible.

Personal Property

Volunteer are asked to keep their belongings at home or in their vehicle. If this is not possible, belongings can be kept in the Volunteer Break Room and/or the Volunteer Coordinator's Office. Giving Children Hope will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen, damaged or misplaced items.

Dress Code

Please remember to dress modestly and comfortably with long pants and closed toed shoes. Please no clothing with offensive language or imagery. During the winter, it is also a good idea to bring a jacket or a sweater as it can get cold in the warehouse.

Phone Use

Giving Children Hope telephones are for business use and should not be used except in case of emergency. Personal phones should only be used during breaks and never in the forklift lanes in the warehouse.

Code of Conduct

- Please refrain from obscene or offensive language or conversations while on the premises. No shouting or screaming is allowed in the work place.
- Please be respectful of staff members focused on their work.
- Be aware as you walk around the warehouse area to avoid pallet jacks or forklifts.
- Please inform your project leader before leaving or taking a break. Volunteers are welcome to use the Volunteer break room. Please clean up after yourself and wash your dishes before you leave.
- Leave your work area clean for the following shift. Be sure to throw away any trash or recyclables in properly marked containers.
- Be sure to turn off or put in silent mode any cell phones, iPods, mp3's, DS, etc. Refrain from using cell phones until on a break or standing outside away from the work site.
- The use of alcohol and/or illicit drugs is strictly prohibited prior to or during the hours served at *Giving Children Hope*. If violated, you will be escorted off property.
- Violation of this Code of Conduct will be noted in a Volunteer's file and may result in dismissal.

Screening for "We've Got Your Back" Distribution

Volunteers interested in participating in the distribution of WGYB backpacks to the schools or in participating in other projects dealing directly with students or children must willingly submit to a background check. Please contact the Volunteer Coordinator for information on any of these projects.

First Aid Emergency Procedures

In the event that you are injured or see someone who is, please seek immediate assistance and inform the Volunteer Coordinator or another staff member as soon as it is appropriate.

Natural Disaster Emergency Procedures

Giving Children Hope Staff Members are trained to direct Volunteers and Guests in the event of a natural disaster. Volunteers must follow all directions given by the GCH staff. Once Volunteers have received instructions and have been directed to a safe location, they should not take move to another location until it is safe to do so. This will allow us to account for all Volunteers and Guests in the building.

Equal Opportunity Statement

It is the policy of Giving Children hope to provide equal Volunteer opportunities to all persons regardless of age, race, color, sex, religion, physical or mental disability, medical condition, pregnancy, ancestry, marital status, or national origin. It is also the policy of GCH to comply with all federal and state laws.

Harassment

It is the policy of Giving Children Hope to expressly forbid any form of harassment. The term "harassment" includes, but is not limited to slurs, jokes, and other verbal, graphic or physical conduct which relate to an individual's race, color, sex religion, national origin, medical condition, citizenship, age or handicap. Harassment also includes sexual advances, request for sexual favors, unwelcome or offensive touching, or other verbal, graphic or physical conduct of a sexual nature. Violation of this policy will subject the perpetrator to disciplinary action which may result in immediate dismissal. Volunteers who feel that they are being harassed in any way by another Volunteer or Employee should inform the Volunteer Coordinator immediately. Any concerns will be handled promptly and kept confidential. An investigation will be conducted and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken.
